The Advanced Level class is held on Tuesday nights and Basic Level is held every Wednesday. There are eight students in the Adv-Level and six in the Basic Level.

As is usual in Gaelic Classes in Australia, there is a wide variety of students. The Adv-Level consists of six men and two women and three of the men are Irish born. In the Basic-Level there are two men and four women with one native-born Irelander• who came here as a child.

Ten Canberrans intend going to the Winter School in Sydney in June over the Queen's Birthday weekend and we're planning to put on a humorous sketch.

Thanks Canberra for getting in touch. We're so pleased to hear from Gaelgeóiri elsewhere in Australia. Its encouraging to know that you are also out there doing your bit to keep the Gaelic Language alive and lively in Australia. Our government has refused to allocate an extra frequency which would allow SBS to cater for all.

Our aim is to help everyone learn and use the Irish language. It is not our intention to provide links to general interest sites about Ireland.

Now that committee has taken ownership of the website we are legally responsible for everything that appears on it, so all additions and changes from now on must be discussed and formally approved. This sounds bureaucratic but it is very necessary.

## **Website Guidelines**

Here are some guidelines.

- have an idea, then speak or write to the committee secretary. That way it will come up for discussion at our next monthly meeting.
- If your class wants to do something as a group project then speak to your teacher who will in turn approach the committee on your behalf.
- In either case, be prepared to provide the full text in both languages of what you want added, along with any pictures or graphics. Anything less does not permit a proper evaluation of your idea.
- If you just want some guidance in developing your idea then speak to Stu or to anyone who you think can help, but remember that at some stage you will eventually need to go through the approval process described above, and organising that is your own responsibility.
- The only people who can authorise additions or changes to the website are the elected committee of the Cumann.

# LAUNCH OF 'TÉANAM ORT!'

Apparently the journeys down to Killarney (next to Port Fairy ) provided a great opportunity for discussing difficulties and translating songs.

Hardly were the speeches over than a troop from the Kathleen Macaleer School of Dancing commenced a lively and skillful display of their craft or, more correctly, their art. Nor was there any shortage of musicians or singers there since most of the musicians on the CD were present, together with other guest singers, for the evening.

But it was Mossie's evening and we didn't have long to wait before he came on stage. He sang several of the songs from his CD with many others in the course of the night and all present were highly satisfied with the entertainment. Towards the end of the evening Mossie took a few minutes to thank all those who had helped in the making of the CD and those who had helped to organise the evening's concert. He also thanked the people for coming out to support him.

Mossie as we know, will return to Ireland in a few weeks to spend some time there but it won't be a holiday because his CD has already been launched there and is doing very well; several 'gigs' are lined up for him. With the demand for him there now, you couldn't say when they'll let him come back to us, or if indeed he will return at all? I think he will.

Go safely Mossie and may your journey prosper.

Thíos sa Chlifton Hill Hotel i gCollingwood oíche Dé Domhnaigh 18 Bealtaine a sheoladh an chéad dlúthdhiosca le Muiris Ó Scanláin – 'Téanam Ort!'. Bhí cúl-bheár na hóstlainne lán go doras nuair a chuir Val Noone tús leis an oíche le cur síos cuimsitheach ar Mhuiris féin agus ar a shaol i gCorca Dhuibhne agus i Melbourne.

Ag trácht ar an ndlúthdhiosca dúirt Val go raibh tabhacht ar leith ag baint leis mar 'sé an chéad iarracht é ar chomhphiontaí staire agus traidisiúin an dá thír a léiriú i saothar amháin dá shaghas, agus tugann sé cuireadh dúinn', adúirt Val, 'chun ár sean-oidhreacht a bhlaiseadh ó ghlór fíor-dheimhneach na Gaeltachta'. Agus cad é mar ghlór.

Ansin labhair Criostóir Ó Maonaigh le greann ar ar thárla dó féin agus a chara Muiris, le linn dóibh an dlúthdhiosca a dhéanamh. Ghabh sé a bhuiochas comh maith leis na daoine go léir a tháinig amach chun tacaíocht a thabhairt dó.

Mar is eol dúinn, beidh Muiris ag dul ar ais go hÉireann i gcionn trí nó ceithre seachtainí chun tréimhse ama a chaitheamh ann, ach ní saoire a bheidh i gceist mar tá a dhlúthdhiosca seolta ann cheana féin agus ag déanamh go han-mhaith, agus tá roinnt 'gigeanna' in áirithe dó.
