

We had another successful Daonscoil in January with 75 attendees. We received a grant from the Irish government via the Embassy in Canberra and are very grateful for this support.

Recently we delighted to find out that Glór na nGael in Ireland have again awarded us third prize in the Global Gaeilge competition. This amounts to 2,500 euro and two places at a language course in a Gaeltacht in Ireland.

During December Éamon Ó Neachtain was presented with a *Meritorious Service award for Excellence in Multicultural Affairs* in recognition of the work he does on behalf of the Irish community in Victoria. He was nominated by the Australian Irish Welfare Bureau and the award itself was presented by the Governor of Victoria, Professor David de Kretser. We congratulate you Éamon!

At the start of this term we had a teacher meeting and decided to try out a few new ideas. In the first two terms the lessons for all classes will be based on common themes and we hope this helps to get conversation going between all the students. During Seachtain na Gaeilge in March we plan an evening to showcase the work of each class and at the end of each term we will arrange either an outing or an activity. In the meantime, the teachers and the Cumann committee will be researching a new syllabus that we hope will be suitable for adult learners.

A Belfast radio station known as Radio Fáilte is now providing a series of free Irish lessons on the internet. You can hear them at www.radiofailte.com To kick off the St Patrick's Festivities the annual Mass in the Irish Language will be held in St John's Church, Clifton Hill on Sunday 1st March at 6 pm and featuring our Cumann choir under the leadership of Nóirín Uí Chatháin.

Agallamh na míosa - Elke Watson ag caint faoi IoraRua

n our last issue we featured the new website iorarua.com and we have now managed to tear Elke away from her laptop long enough to fill in a few more details for us.....

Where did the original idea for IoraRua come from ?

First there was the idea to produce a wall calendar as Gaeilge and try to promote this one internationally, which meant that if greater numbers were sold it could be produced in a cheaper off-set method rather than a smaller run done digitally and cost-prohibitive.

Not satisfied with just the wall calendar as a learning tool, a Learner Desk calender was soon on the drawing board and it became clear that the site would now not just serve as a marketing/ advertising tool, as the idea of an accompanying eLearning-type site was also entertained very early on.

The calendars were far from being finished, when work on the site commenced, and it all sort of span out of control. The original scope was quite small, but more and more ideas, logical additions, shortcomings elsewhere on the web just *had* to be addressed.

So in summary, Iora-Rua.com is a site that grew organically, and will continue to do so, time and resources permitting.

Judging by the site it looks like the number of hours work involved in getting it up and running is well into three figures. Have you ever kept a total and was it all done in your spare time?

I meant to keep track of my time and did so initially. The problem with that is that a lot of thinking goes into a site such as IoraRua which is not necessarily time spent in front of a PC

When the idea came into fruition, endless hours were spent discussing possible content and where to go with this, contemplating what I – as a learner – would want from a site that hasn't been done yet, in short doing the Research.

I registered the domain around March 2008, and from then on it was development, design, testing, checking, rechecking. A lot of coffee, and a lot of late nights and in the early stages, every free waking minute.

Yes, the work was all done in my spare time, often to the detriment of paid contract work. I had a plan of doing a 'Myles na gCopaleen' but the Irish Times had no job opening for me, not even as a Book Handler.

Do you have any sponsorship or will you be looking even-

tually at having paid advertising?

The Irish Consulate General in Sydney, once they learned about IoraRua late last year, were incredibly supportive of the project and offered very kindly some cultural funding to help offset the costs involved in launching this project.

Apart from that, all the cost for the running (web-hosting, domain name etc.) of the site is out of my own pocket. Any assistance I have had or get with content creation and maintenance is all voluntary.

We need to establish a bit of a track record with a regular visitor base, before pushing to make a little bit of money out of advertising. We are looking for more business enterprise partners to provide paid advertising to help further reduce the running costs of the site, in order to provide more and ever better content for the global Irish language community, and of course to ensure the site's future.

The plight of the Red Squirrel itself in Ireland is well documented. Could it be seen as metaphor for language decline and revival?

The name for the site was picked for different reasons, but we will never know how the subconscious mind

works at times?! The Red Squirrel is the native species in Ireland, whereas the Grey Squirrel is introduced. The conditions for the Red Squirrel are less favourable for a number of reasons than for their grey counterparts, resulting in their decline (to the point of having to be reintroduced). Their plight is now recognised and being managed, so it would be absolutely reasonable to draw parallels between the Irish language and Ireland's Red Squirrel, an t-Iora Rua.

The red squirrel is generally just a joyful animal, embedded into Norse mythology (as Ratatosk, the messenger), as well as evoking some fond childhood memories. I liked the association with it being a gatherer of fruit and nuts, and the adoption of the name for the website meant we could stay clear of overused Celtic symbols.

What kind of things, eg site content or merchandise, on Iora Rua, are NOT available anywhere else?

The main two products at the moment are two calendars as Gaeilge - products whose sales will obviously wind down very soon. There is an art calendar featuring artist Caoimhghin Ó Croidheáin – absolutely stunning artwork and we are so happy and privileged to have worked with Cao-

imhghin. Then there is the 'flagship' - the Learner calendar 'Tuiaim Anois'. This desk calendar was designed with the learner in mind, and to encourage the use of the language even, or particularly, outside the classroom. So you'll find activities in there such as Origami folding, cooking, Grammar explanations etc. with even more activities and explanation on the 'Companion website', an idea which is usually deployed by big publishers for textbooks, but very much lent itself to this product.

This calendar is the inaugural one for a planned series of reference cards. Since its inception a few more experienced Irish speakers/ teachers have pledged to help.

And as I mentioned earlier, being an – often bewildered – learner myself, there is tons of material that is waiting (almost screaming) to be published.

The products are going to support the site, and vice versa. The calendars are very work-intensive and with their 'perishable' nature a bit nerve-wrecking come sales time. I have a few other ideas already of products which could be handy for a learner, at the moment just tucked away in my head.

Further, there are a few T-shirts, mugs available in Zazzle (an online shop), with more designs (quite modern and 'hip') being planned and uploaded in the near future. The monies from these go of course mainly to Zazzle, with a small royalty benefiting the site.
