Cur síos ar an gclár Tríd an bhfoghlaím chumaisc, in imeacht dhá bhliain, a chuirtear an MA/Diplóma Iarchéime (Léann Teanga) ar fáil. Meascán a bheidh ann de chianfhoghlaím (teagasc tríd an idirlíon) agus ceardlanna míosúla ar champus na hOllscoile.

Cuirfear oiliúint ort i ngnéithe tábhachtacha den Léann Teanga. Áirítear orthu sin **Cruinnscríobh na Gaeilge** (ardchruinneas i scríobh na Gaeilge; léargas ar an téarmeolaíocht, mar aon le ceartúsáid uirlisí foclóireachta agus téarmaíochta), **Modheolaíochtaí Taighde** (modheolaiochtaí le haghaidh taighde iarchéime), an **Scríbhneoireacht Acadúil** (mar a mbeidh deis agat iris acadúil phiarmheasúnaithe ar líne a ullmhú), mar aon le gnéithe den **Chumarsáid Ghairmiúil** – straitéisí agus uirlisí éagsúla a úsáidtear chun cáipéisí gairmiúla ar ardchaighdeán a chur i gcrích agus a chur i láthair. Lena chois sin, beidh deis agat speisialtóireacht a dhéanamh i gceann de na sainábhair seo a leanas:

Aistriúchán: Sa sainábhar seo, scrúdófar na modhanna is éifeachtaí chun téacsanna aistriú go Gaeilge. Cíorfar na cineálacha téacsanna is mó a mbíonn aistritheoirí gairmiúla ag plé leo agus na dúshláin is suntasaí a bhaineann leis an nGaeilge mar sprioctheanga aistriúcháin. Beidh béisim ar theicneolaíocht an aistriúcháin chun go mbeidh do chumas aghaidh a thabhairt ar an margadh fostáiochta agus na scileanna riachtanacha teanga agus teicneolaiochta araon sealbhaithe acu.

Pleanáil Teanga: Sa sainábhar seo, scrúdófar na coincheapa agus na beartais is nua-aimseartha sna réimsí éagsúla a thagann faoi scáth na pleanála teanga: an tsochttheangeolaíocht; an teangeolaíocht; an phleanáil straitéisearch. Tá an sainábhar seo dirithe ar dhaoine a bhfuil spéis acu i gcúrsaí teanga agus sna bealaí éagsúla ar féidir dul i bhfeidhm ar phobail teanga d'fhoins spriocanna sainiúla a bhaint amach. Breathnófar go mion ar ghnéithe a bhaineann leis an bpleanáil teanga sa chomhthéacs náisiúnta agus idirnáisiúnta.

Riachtanais iontrála Bunchéim 2:2 ag leibhéal 8 nó 2:2 i gclár iarchéime i réimse gaolmhar, mar aon le caighdeán sásúil i scríobh na Gaeilge.

Is féidir le hiarrthóirí nach bhfuil na cálíochtaí acadúla cuí acu, ach a bhfuil ar a laghad cúig bliana de thaithí ghairmiúil acu i réimse gaolmhar d'earnáil na teanga iarratas a dhéanamh faoi chóras na hOllscoile d'Aitheantas don Réamhfoghlaím (RPL).

Deiseanna gairme Uillmhóidh an cúrsa seo thí chun tabhairt faoi ghairm in earnáil na teanga. I measc na n-eagraíochtaí a phostáonn mic léinn de chuid an ábhair seo, tá institiúidí an Aontais Eorpaigh, institiúidí aistriúcháin de chuid an Stáit, cuideachtaí priobháideacha aistriúcháin, údaráis áitiúla, eagraíochtaí forbartha de chuid an Stáit, institiúidí oideachais, eagraíochtaí pobail, srl.

Scoil Teanga Canberra 2016—ag teacht go luath !

Our travelling reporter managed to catch up with a representative of the Canberra Irish Language Association (CILA) who are busy organising this year's summer camp. Here's an update on what's happening and you can book now using the flyer enclosed with this newsletter.

Thanks for talking to us, Kaaren Sephton, can you firstly tell us about the weekly classes in Canberra.

Weekly classes are held at the Irish Club on Tuesday evenings (except for school holidays) at beginner level (6pm to 7pm) and higher conversation levels from 7pm. The conversation group at 7pm are led by a trained teacher. All interested speakers are welcome.

Is there a large Irish community in Canberra?

There is a dedicated small group of interested Irish speakers in Canberra. There is a larger group - Friends of Ireland, who have a broad range of members not all of whom are Irish language speakers. They meet at the Irish Club on a regular basis.

For those who may be new to the idea tell us what the Scoil Teanga in January is all about.

The inaugural Scoil Teanga Canberra 2016 is a long (Australia Day) weekend of Irish language and 'craic' (fun). For anyone who wants to improve their Irish speaking

The school is open to adults from across Australia:

- complete newcomers to the Irish language
- those who want to improve their Irish, for example those who learned it at school
- fluent speakers who want to meet to converse in Irish and to help others learn.

There are classes at different levels to suit the Irish language skills of the participants. Other Irish activities provide a break in a friendly atmosphere. These include the official opening, table quiz, guest speaker, concert, singing, tin whistle, music and dance. Informal sessions continue into the wee small hours. Come and join the fun.

Canberra 2016 promises to be new and exciting. Can you describe the venue and facilities.

Venue is the YMCA Bush Capital Lodge, 191 Dryandra St, O'Connor, ACT

Single rooms and bunk beds are available at the YMCA Bush Capital Lodge. Meals are provided from lunch Saturday through to breakfast on Tuesday. lunch, dinner and refreshments are provided.

The Scoil Teanga commences at 2pm on Saturday 23 January 2016 and finishes at 12 noon on Tuesday 26 January 2016

Registration is from 10am onwards on Saturday



How soon do students need to apply?

Applications are being taken now.

How many classes do you hope to have?

There are classes at five levels to suit the Irish language skills of the participants.

Level 1 (beginners) People with no prior knowledge of Irish or who have been studying for less than one year.

Level 2 (continuing) Students who have now completed level 1 or who have studied Irish at some earlier stage in the past, for example at school.

Level 3 (intermediate) Students who have been studying for at least two years and who are now approaching the conversation stage.

Level 4 (advanced) Generally, those who are comfortable for the entire lesson to be conducted in Irish.

Level 5 (conversation) Conversation group. It is anticipated that this group will be led by Barney Devlin.

If people want to spend a few extra days sightseeing what are the top attractions that you would recommend in Canberra ?

Canberra has the Australian War Memorial – always popular with visitors – displays are constantly being updated. Also the National and Portrait Galleries for art lovers. There is the National Museum of Australia for a trip through history as well as the Democracy Museum, markets and coffee shops.

Uinsionn Ó Gormáin (1936-2015)

Bualadh buille fé dhó ar an gCumann i gcionn roinnt seachtainí atá díreach thart. I mBealtaine chailleamar Cathal Céitinn, fear a thug tacaíocht bhuan don Chumann i gcónaí; agus sa mhí seo chaite d'éag ár n-Uinsionn beag Ó Gormáin in aois a naoi déag is trí fichid, duine eile a d'fhan dílis daingean don Ghaeilge i rith a shaol.

Saolaíodh Uinsionn i gcathair Swift agus Joyce i 1936, ach ba leis an Ghaeilge a thug sé a dhílseacht ón lá a chuaigh sé ar scoil na mban rialta ar dtús agus ansin go dtí na Bráithre Críostúla.

Ina óige d'fhreastal sé ar ranganna Gaeilge i lár na cathrach agus bhí sé ina bhall den Chumann Céiteannaigh, b' é sin craobh Chonradh na Gaeilge ina raibh an poblachtachas ba láidre ó aimsir Chathal Brugha, Piaras Béasláí, 'Sceilg' agus a leithéidí. Dá bhrí sin ní aon ionad é gur Poblachtach Uinsionn ina aigne agus ina chroí.

Bhí a smaointe féin aige ar chúrsaí polaitíochta in Éirinn féin agus san Astráil chomh maith, agus é lán ábalta iad a léiriú do chách in airde a ghuth [ar ndóigh bhí an fear bocht cuibheasach bodhar sna blianta deireanacha].

D'oibrigh Uinsionn i bpoist éagsúla i rith a shaol, in Éirinn, i Londain agus, ó 1964 i leith, san am a bhuaile sé port anseo i Melbourne. Déarfaí gur sa Queensland, le linn dó bheith ag obair sa tionscal shiúcra, a céad chur Uinsionn aithne ar shaol na gnáth-Astrálaigh agus ar inimircigh ó thíortha eile chomh maith, ach leis an bhfiche bliain is deireanaí ba bhall den lucht oibre le Telecom [murab ainm an ull-comhlucht poiblí sin tráth dá raibh] anseo i Melbourne a bhí sé, é ag obair mar ghiolla stórais agus é ina stíobhard nó mhaor sa cheardchumann, sula d'éisigh sé as ar fad.

Sea, tá Uinsionn imithe uainn, ach is fada a bheidh cuimhneamh air ag muintir na Gaeilge agus ag Éireannaigh i gcoitinne i Melbourne agus níos faide ó thuaidh sa thír seo. Bleá Chliathach go smior ab ea Uinsionn agus tuin na cathrach úd ar a chuid cainte agus ar a chuid amhrán, cuma Béarla nó Gaeilge a bhí á labhairt aige. Cheapfá gur díreach ón aerfort a tháinig sé cé go raibh sé san Astráil le níos mó ná leath chéad bliain.

Ag dul isteach sa Celtic Club dom as seo amach beidh mé ag díriú mo shuíle ar an mbord beag sa chúinne mar ba ghnáth liom, ach faraor, ní bheidh Uinsionn beag suite ann níos mó, pionta Guinness os a chomhair amach - Uinsionn in easnamh agus

sinn go léir níos boichte ina éagmais. É sin ráite is iad muintir Uí Ghormáin go háirithe a bheidh thíos le cailliúint a deartháir, a n-uncail agus a seanuncail, gan trácht ar an slua mór a bhí i láthair ag an tsochraid i Springvale Cemetery. Taispeánadh é sna scéalta grinn mar gheall air a bhí ag a sheanchairde Muiris Ó Mórdha agus Siún Uí Mhaoldomhnaigh. Chomh maith le sin bhain gach duine a bhí ann tait-neamh as a raibh le rá ina thaobh ag beirt nia Breandán agus Senán, agus as an teachtaireacht óna neach Treasa i Sasana; ba rí-soiléir an grá a bhí ag a mhuintir do 'uncle Vince'.

Cé a dheimhniú nach raibh an fear féin suite sa chúinne, a cheann ina leathlámh aige ag éisteacht agus an miongháire ar a bhéal i gcónaí. Slán go deo, a Uinsionn, ólfaimid gloine den leann dubh Bleá Cliathach i ndíl cuimhne ort.

Important Notice To All Cumann Members

Your membership of Cumann Gaeilge na hAstráile does not include membership of the Celtic Club, but up to now the Club have treated us as a "corporate member" thereby allowing any of our own members to be on the premises without being signed in.

From July 2015 we have been advised by the Club that corporate membership no longer exists and that to be on the premises after that date you must be either -

- Celtic Club full member (cost \$25 p.a.)
- Celtic Club social member (cost \$10 p.a.)
- Guest who has been signed in by a full member

Note that social membership of the CC carries no privileges other than entry to the premises. So if you want cheaper prices at the bar you must become a full member. We encourage all our own members to become either full or social CC members.

If you do not do this you will need to be signed in to the building each week, otherwise you are unlawfully on the premises and could be asked to leave by the staff. If that happens we cannot help you.

To take out Celtic Club membership, either full or social, you must deal with the Club directly and pay them the appropriate fee when submitting your application. Membership forms are available in the bar and also online.
